

Mrs. Carlucci's Classroom Expectations and Procedures

Expectations:

- Students are expected to arrive on time and prepared to work.
- Active participation, questions, and mistakes are expected. (Yes, mistakes. Take a risk! We'll correct mistakes together.)
- Be "Responsible, Reasonable, and RESPECTFUL"!!!
- Hats, gum, backpacks, and cell phones are not allowed!
- With the exception of water, food and drink are only allowed at snack time.
- All school rules apply in my classroom.

Materials:

- Composition book for notes and homework
- Pocket folder for handouts, quizzes, and tests
- Pencils!! (handheld sharpener would be useful as well)
- Fully charged iPad!

Homework:

- Homework (approx. 15-20 minutes worth) will be assigned nearly every night to practice the concepts learned in class.
- We will review the homework daily and questions are encouraged.
- Assignments must be on time and complete! This means it must be with you in class, not in your locker or at home, at the start of class. Late or incomplete assignments will be marked down (Late (L) = 75% and Incomplete (I) = 85%). Late assignments will be accepted until the end of the term.
- Homework problems MUST be done in your composition book.
- I will grade homework based on the **EFFORT** put into it. You must give an honest attempt for EVERY problem and SHOW ALL WORK. Since homework will not be graded for accuracy, it is the student's responsibility to review incorrect work and get help if necessary.

Grading:

- A point system will be used in determining grades. Students can calculate their grades by dividing the total points earned by the total number of possible points.
- A short quiz can be expected about once a week.
- Tests (or Quests) are given at the end of each unit.
- Students who earn a 75% or below on tests are required to make corrections and can increase their score up to a 75%.
- Students with exceptional homework performance and participation may see their grade raised at the end of the term.

Extra Help:

- Your teacher should be your first resource and not your last resort!
- I am available Monday – Thursday until 3:00 pm. Please let me know you will be coming to avoid conflicts with school-related meetings. Common time is also a great time for extra help.
- Extra help is given on a first-come, first-served basis.

Extra Credit:

- Extra credit opportunities will be provided each term, but not on an individual basis.
