- The ADL's World of Difference® Institute has sponsored Peer Training Programs in more than 60 middle and high schools in the New England region, reaching more than 50,000 students each year.
- Through the program, Peer Trainers are provided with:
 - ✓ facilitation techniques that stress the importance of participation and interaction;
 - ✓ the creation of a safe environment in which the students identify, examine and address personal and institutional prejudice and discrimination
 - ✓ activities designed to increase awareness of the value of diversity; and
 - ✓ action planning strategies.
- Peer trainers will deliver workshops to groups of approximately 20 middle school students. Through identity, language, cultural awareness and action planning activities, middle school students will gain
 - ✓ An increased understanding of the causes of prejudice;
 - ✓ fuller appreciation of racial, ethnic, cultural and other individual differences; and
 - ✓ conflict resolution skills to respond positively in the face of discrimination.
