Senior Community Service Project

Class of 2019

The community service learning project continues in honor of Dr. Harris, a longtime Harvard resident, as a graduation requirement at Bromfield. In the words of Dr. Harris, *This is a real world learning experience... involving yourself in giving time, effort and thought, working alone or with others, in a program that would not be done or done as well if you were not there.* Therefore, all graduating seniors must complete a minimum of 40 hours of community service.

The Project and service will:

- * provide the student with a meaningful opportunity to address a real community need or problem.
- * allow the student to gain a greater understanding of a community need.
- * allow the student to use their skills and knowledge that they gained throughout high school to address a community need.
- * provide the student with the opportunity to grow personally and academically.
- * be completed at one organization

The Service Project Requirements

Investigation

- Identify a need in your local, regional, or global community
Contact a community agency or local organization, who currently addresses the need, to gather additional information.

Preparation / Planning

- Work with your selected Service-Learning Provider to identify specific duties that would be expected of you and when you will be able to work with them.
- Complete the service learning project proposal form neatly and in pen, including necessary signatures
- You must submit the proposal and have the project approved before you begin.
- **If you plan on starting during the summer, you must submit your application on or before Monday, June 4th.** ** Hours completed during the summer without prior approval may not qualify for the 40 minimum requirement.
- The deadline for submission of all applications is October 1, 2018.
- All project proposals will be reviewed and approved by the Service Project Committee.

Action / Service

- Must be completed at one organization (To split service between two relevant/connected projects, special permission must be granted and a new proposal written and approved)
- Must be a nonprofit organization
- May not be self-serving (ex. You can't raise money for a sports team you are on, or do a project that is more like an internship or is a prerequisite for a future paying job.)

After securing the approvals, begin your service and start recording hours.

- **Each** time you complete hours, complete your time card (in PEN) and have your mentor assigned to oversee your volunteer work sign it.
- If a change is made on the timesheet, have your supervisor initial the change.
- Timesheets will be collected throughout the year; see attached timeline.
- The hours must be done outside of school hours. Any hours done during school time will not be counted.
- Travel time and meal breaks do not count towards the required service hours.
- Overnight hours do not count
- Soliciting funds in and of itself is not a community service project. In other words, you may not write a letter to ask people for money and count that as service. You may however, work with your organization on a fundraising project.

The Service Learning Project folder/ packet

1. Contains all of your important information including due dates and requirements.
 2. Contains a record of your service. Make sure to keep copies of papers that you handed in, ex. Proposal and time cards.
 3. Contains pictures, brochures, etc. that you have collected during your experience.
- ** A complete and organized folder will help make the final reflection and presentation much easier.

Reflection

- Reflect on your experience before, during and after the service. For example, keep a journal.
- Write your reflection paper.

The Reflection Paper:

A paper at least 2 pages long, (double spaced, New Roman, 12pt) reflecting your community service experience. Include the following information:

- An introduction which explains the who, what, where, and when of your community service
- A brief explanation of the organization or agency sponsoring your community service, who they serve and how they help the community.
- Overall feelings about the whole experience.
- Other things to consider in writing your reflection:
 - What you learned about others from this experience.
 - What you learned about yourself through this experience.
 - What did you observe during your service that made an impact on you and how?
 - How was this activity different from other educational activities?

****The paper will be handed to the panel of judges at the time of your presentation.**

Demonstration: The Presentation and Community Showcase

-All students will be required to give an individual presentation to a panel of community members and teachers. Once your final completed time sheet is handed in, you will be able to sign up for your presentation time.

- The presentation must be eight to ten minutes long and must include:
 - information about the organization
 - details of how you helped the organization
 - reflection on what this project has taught you.
- You must have an individual visual component for the presentation. It should be colorful, neat, organized and free of spelling and grammar errors.

This can include:

- poster with pictures and material from your experience
 - power point or other electronic presentation
 - another type of “show and tell” items that illustrates your experience
- Remember- you should gather brochures, take pictures, etc. so you can use them as visual pieces of the presentation.

The presentation should be organized and structured and you should rely on all of the skills that you have been taught about good presentation format and delivery.

The panel of judges will provide you with written feedback within a few days of your presentation.

The Community Showcase:

You will present your project to the community in an open house event at Bromfield. During this time, members of the community will come in to view your projects and talk with you briefly about what you have accomplished.

First and foremost, you should see this project as an opportunity to grow and learn something new about yourself and your community. Some of the best projects in the past have come from people who made choices that scared them a bit at first.

Remember that this is a graduation requirement!
